Friday 01/06/07 Woolston Eyes 1000-1320 Sunny and Warm!

The crew, although quite small due to holiday absences, was added to by a member of the Tuesday Team who soon absorbed into the gathering and we soon pushed off towards the Weir pausing to note a family party of **Mute Swans**, which battled against the flow of the Mersey as it pushed onto the sea!

A pause atop the bank of No2 bed gave us views into No3 bed (our destination for the visit) whilst we were treated to the fluty song of a **Blackcap** which contrasted with the equally enthusiastic but scratchier song of a **Whitethroat** that bobbed about No2 bed.

Our steady progress towards the Ship Canal allowed views into the bunded off section of the river which gave Coot, Cormorant, Gadwall and Tufted Duck

The bridge was safely negotiated onto No3 bed and soon we were peering from the viewing platform that gives views south - North across No3 bed. From here we gained superb views of a pair of Black Necked Grebes, which were constantly diving for food for their demanding brood of 2 chicks. Other birds noted were Shoveler, Long Tailed Tit, Reed Bunting and Reed Warblers.

We moved on towards the centre hide pausing in the Sybil Hogg Hide to check out a nesting **Lapwing** which obligingly gave us views of its nest which contained at least 2 camouflaged eggs.

The centre hide held our attention for a while whilst we took in more views of **Black Necked Grebes**. We also added **Great Crested Grebe** and **Wigeon** to our list.

A move to the next hide was briefly halted whilst we took in both the sight and sound of a **Sedge Warbler**, which proclaimed its territory in the nearby undergrowth.

Views from the higher vantage point of Linley Hide gave us **Ruddy Duck** and at the feeding station **Bullfinch**. Then it was time to complete our circumnavigation of No3 bed and set our compasses on a clear path home out of the now glorious June sunshine that had blessed our jaunt to Woolston. Dave
