## TREES ALONG THE MERSEY

Planting began in the winter of 1983/4 with Sycamore (Acer pseudoplatanus), which were later removed except for one near the footbridge, followed by three Alder (Alnus sp.) During 1984/5 planting began in earnest with Lime (Tilia platyphyllos), Oak (Quercus robur), Ash (Fraxinus excelsior), Poplar (Populus alba) and Elm (Ulmus sp.)

This winter there have been plantings of Birch (Betula sp.), Whitebeam (Sorbus aria), Rowan (Sorbus aucuparia), more Alder (Alder glutinosa) and Poplar, plus some shrubs, Hazel (Corylus avellana), Elder (Sambucus nigra), Field Maple (Acer campestre), Honeysuckle (Lonicera periclymenum), Hawthorn (Crataegus monogyna), Guelder Rose (Viburnum opulus), plus some mistletoe berries (Visum album) which have been pressed into the bark of a mature Poplar and Sycamore. Although some of the plantings may seem close together they will be thinned out as they mature.
